A School-Parent Compact is an agreement that parents, students, and teachers develop together. It explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all students reach grade-level academic standards.

This compact will:

- Outline the methods the school will employ to offer tools for targeted at-home learning to foster student academic progress.
- Detail the duties of both parents and students in participating in designated at-home educational activities to advance student academic development.
- Illustrate how consistent mutual communication will be facilitated between parents and the school.
- Define the collaborative approach between the school and parents to support students in meeting the State's elevated academic benchmarks.

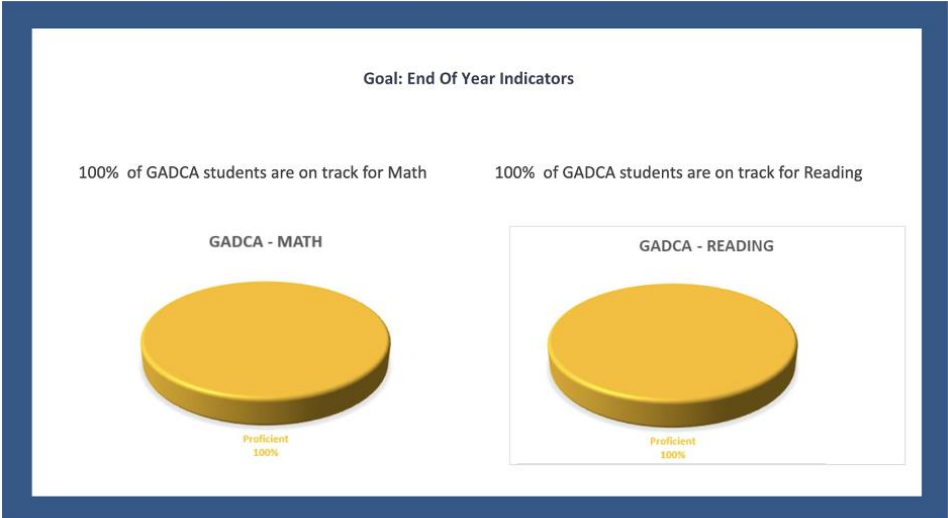
Communication about Student Progress

GADCA prioritizes regular and meaningful communication with families about student learning. Our channels of communication encompass email, phone calls, text messages, our online school messaging system, school announcements, newsletters, the GADCA website, and the Parent Resources page. Families can easily connect with our staff through email, phone, live sessions, and our online school platform.

Parents can opt to receive regular updates on their student's progress through their chosen mode of communication, be it email or text notifications. We always encourage Parents and Learning Coaches to participate and observe our live virtual classes alongside their students.

To keep families informed of academic progress, we distribute progress reports after the 1st and 3rd quarters. Additionally, comprehensive report cards are issued after the conclusion of the 2nd and 4th quarters.
